<sup>1</sup> You are expected to have completed all your General Education requirements in the first two years of your college career. See the Undergraduate Catalog (pp. 38-45) for the specifics. "General Education *Distributive* Requirements" are six credits of science, six credits of behavioral or social science, six credits of humanities (outside your major), and three credits of art.

<sup>2</sup> Consider signing up for a minor—including minors housed in the philosophy department (religious studies and peace & conflict studies). Also keep in mind the kinds of courses the General Education requirement demands, such as Writing Emphasis courses ("W"), a Diverse Communities course ("J"), and an Interdisciplinary course ("I").

Note: In addition to the categories and courses listed above, general education distributive requirements must include three “W” writing emphasis courses, a “J” diverse communities course, and an “I” interdisciplinary course.
