College Reading and Study Skills: Course and Enrollment Information

The Literacy Department offers a course to help students enhance their college-level reading and study skills: *EDR 120: College Reading and Study Skills*. This course is open to any student at the university.

EDR 120 College Reading and Study Skills (3)

Description: This course is designed for students who wish to improve their college level reading and study skills. Students will learn a wide range of reading and writing strategies (note taking, textbook reading and marking, time management, test taking) that can be applied across disciplines and in other college courses. This course is organized around thematic inquiries so that students can practice and apply critical literacy and critical thinking skills through engaging in dialogue around cross-disciplinary issues.

Skills Developed: Students will develop reading and study skills such as comprehension, vocabulary, speed, remembering, concentration, taking notes, mastering a text assignment, and preparing for and taking examinations.

EDR 120 is typically offered every fall, spring, and summer II semester:

- EDR 120 is a free elective open to any and all students during the fall and spring semesters.
- EDR 120 runs during summer II; however, summer session seats are only available to students within the Academic Success Program (ASP).
